traditions a rich heritage often overlooked in western christianity by exploring the various ways in which eastern theologians understood the third person of the trinity volume 2 showed how modern christians can gain a wider vision and fuller understanding of the workings of the holy spirit in history and in our own generation this concluding volume examines medieval roman catholic and reformation attitudes toward the holy spirit beginning with the writings of medieval catholic theologians from gregory the great and bede to aquinas and bonaventure subsequent sections describe the contributions of influential women such hildegard of bingen birgitta of sweden and catherine of siena fringe figures such as joachim of fiore and the cathars the magisterial reformers luther zwingli and calvin leading catholic reformers such as ignatius of loyola and the radical reformers thomas muntzer and menno simons
